CAMPING

- Only one wheeled camping unit is allowed per site. There is no limit on the number of tents, provided they fit within the perimeter of the campsite.
- Maximum camping duration is **14 days** within any 21-day period.
- A non-family group may not exceed **six persons.** A "family" is limited to parent(s) and dependent children, and not more than two guests.
- Camping permits are valid from 3 pm of the first day to 3 pm of the last day. Check out time is 3 pm.
- Limited security is provided by State Forest personnel. Secure all valuables before leaving your campsite.

FIREWORKS & FIREARMS

- Use of fireworks are illegal within the campgrounds. Anything ignited that flies or explodes is considered a firework.
- All firearms must be unloaded and cased while in any campground.

PETS

- · Pets must be on a leash no longer than eight feet at all times. Please clean up after your pets.
- · Pets are not allowed in buildings or at beaches, playgrounds or picnic areas.

CAMPGROUND RULES AND REGULATIONS

CAMPFIRES

- Contain fires within the metal fire ring provided at each site. For the health of fellow campers, don't burn trash.
- Don't leave your fire unattended and be sure to extinguish it completely before leaving your campsite.
- Firewood can be purchased on-site. To protect our forest, firewood must be purchased within 10 miles of the campground, be DATCP-certified, or gathered dead and downed wood on the state forest. Do not cut live trees or brush. No firewood allowed from out of state.
- Charcoal and gas grills are allowed. Carefully dispose of all used charcoal.

SANITARY FACILITIES

- To maintain safe potable water, don't wash dishes at the pump.
- A sanitary dump station is located near the entrance of Castle Mound Campground which is open from May to October.
- Safe potable water is provided at all campgrounds.
- Trash and recycling receptacles are provided at all campgrounds for registered campers only.

NOISE

· At no time may the noise in your campsite interfere with the enjoyment of your fellow campers. Quiet hours are 11 pm to 6 am. Campground is closed to visitors and vehicle traffic during quiet hours.

• Use of generators is not permitted.

MOTOR VEHICLES

- No more than two vehicles may be parked at the campsite. Keep vehicles on gravel pads. Park extra vehicles at designated parking lots.
- No motorized recreational vehicles (UTV/ATV) allowed in campgrounds.

TICKS AND LYME DISEASE

Ticks are common across Wisconsin and may be found in the forest. Lyme disease is an illness that can be spread to humans from the bite of a tick. You can protect yourself against Lyme disease and other tick-borne diseases using these tips:

- Stay in the middle of trails.
- Apply insect repellent on exposed skin and over clothes.
- Wear light-colored clothes to spot ticks more easily.
- Do a full-body tick check after outdoors activities.

East Fork and Pigeon Creek Campgrounds are rustic, with vault toilets and hand pump water. The Indoor Group Camp has a four season cabin that sleeps 12 people and an outdoor area that accommodates an additional 13 people. The rustic Outdoor Group Camp also accommodates up to 50 people.




